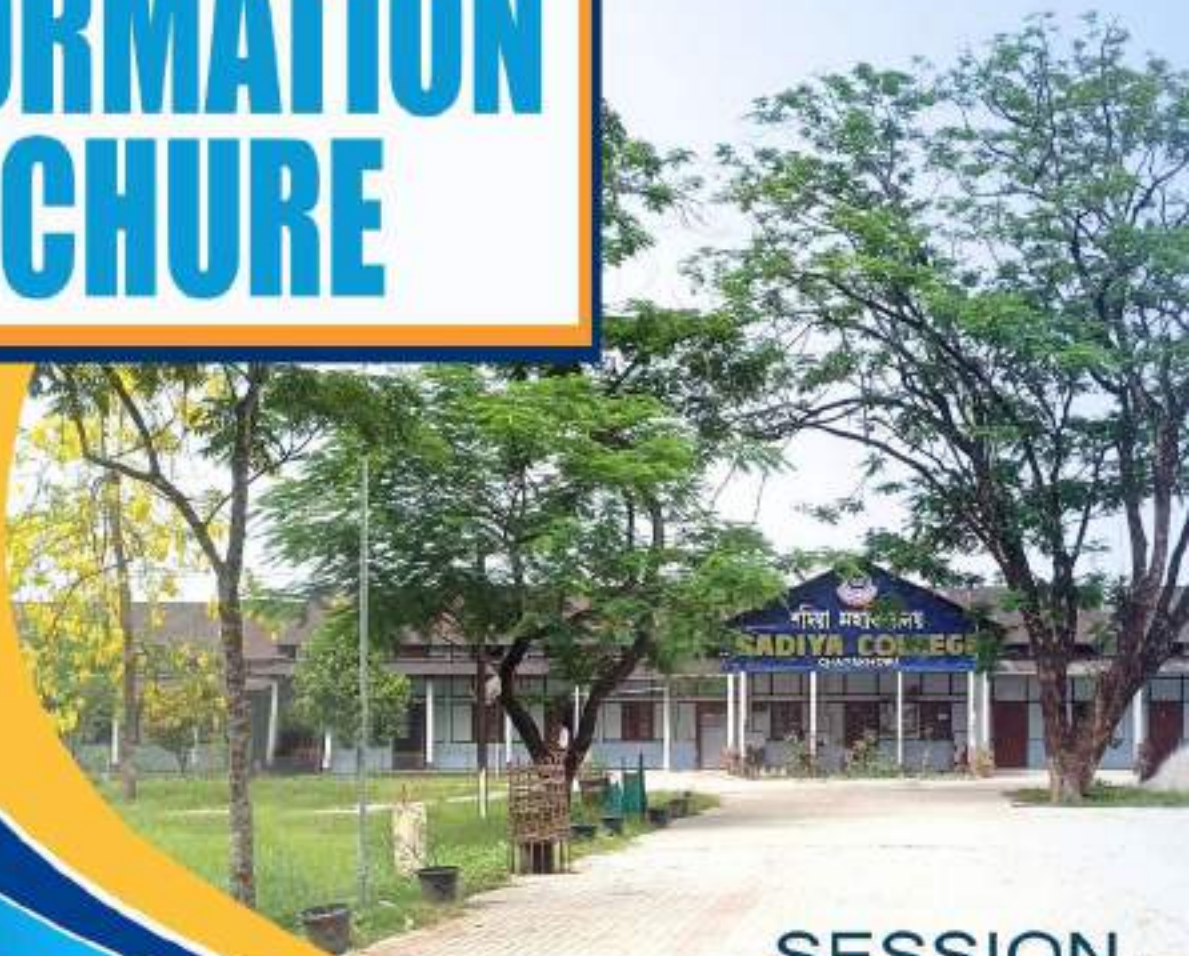

COLLEGE PROFILE

Sadiya, a historically important sub-division of Tinsukia district, is located in the far east of the state of Assam. The unique culture of the region has been shaped by many ethnic groups living through different historical eras. Once geographically isolated, the surface communication gap of the region has been narrowed down recently with the completion of several strategically important infrastructural projects. The region is surrounded by Arunachal Pradesh in the East, River Brahmaputra and Dibang in the South and West, respectively. The region is rich in biodiversity with several species of important flora and fauna.

Most of the population of the locality rely on cultivation and only a few of them could send their children out of the sub-division for pursuing higher education. Geographical isolation was a major impediment in the pursuance of higher education outside the region. Under such circumstances some farsighted citizens decided to setup a degree college at Chapakhowa through a historic resolution adopted in the meeting held in the first half of August, 1982 at Sadiya Govt. H.S. School. As a result, Sadiya College was established in the middle of Chapakhowa Town on 6th September, 1982 with a great vision. After few years of enthusiastic performance and dedicated services of the teaching and non-teaching staffs the college was brought under the Deficit-Grant-in-Aid system by the Govt. of Assam in 1989. In this regard, the inexhaustible patience and abled guidance of the founder Principal Mr. Kirti Chandra Phukan is really praiseworthy.

As the lone higher academic institution in this entire region the college has been providing a platform for the realization of academic dreams of thousands of students from Sadiya and nearby areas of Arunachal Pradesh since its inception. The college provides courses in Arts, Commerce and Science both in graduate and undergraduate levels. The mission of the college is to disseminate knowledge, cater inclusive education to all and train the students for self-reliance, sustainable development and as responsible global citizens.

Located in a campus of 42 bighas of land the college has descent infrastructural facilities. The classrooms and administrative offices are housed in a large assam type pucca building. The college has a separate library building with sufficient resources and reading space. In addition to these the college has facilities like science laboratories, computer and language laboratories, gymnasium, parking place, hostels and canteen. The college is equipped with internet facilities like high-speed WiFi and optical fiber.

Under Graduate

As per the notification of the Registrar, Dibrugarh University, Dibrugarh vide notification no. DU/DR-A/6-1/19/412 dated 02.05.2019, Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) for under graduate courses have been adopted. CBCS is a flexible system of learning, where credit defines the quantum of contents syllabus prescribed for a course and determines the number of hours of instruction required. Here the traditional concept of paper is replaced by course. In the CBCS system, an academic year is 12 months duration with 02 semesters. The semester is a half yearly term including examinations, vacations and semester breaks. The term credit states the quantum of contents/syllabus prescribed for a course and determines the number of hours of instruction required per week. Therefore, in each of the course, credits have been assigned on the basis of the contents of lectures/tutorials/laboratory work and other form of learning required to complete the course contents in a 14-15week schedule. The semesters are classified as odd (June to November) and even (December to May) semesters (any change in the academic calendar/schedule can be made by the university authority whenever required). The core courses are the compulsory components of an academic programme. The contents of core courses shall be as per the UGC model curriculum for the subject/discipline concerned. Elective courses shall be chosen by each student from a pool of courses. Such courses may be intra-departmental (Discipline Specific Elective) as well as inter-departmental (Generic Elective). The CBCS system includes the Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC). The AEC courses shall be of two types – Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses and Skill Enhancement Courses. The AEC is always inter-disciplinary in nature. Student's minimum compulsory attendance is 80% during the total number of class days. Students less than 80% of attendance will not be allowed to sit for the End-semester examination. The examination evaluation shall be performed according to the University Guideline.

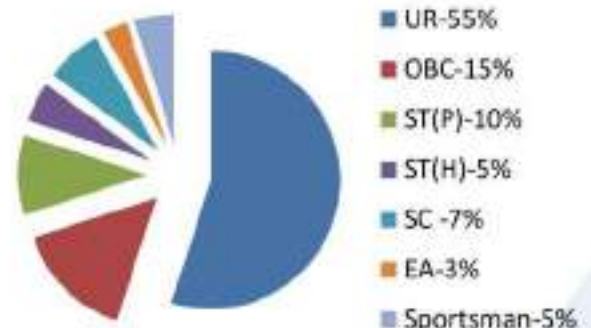


Admission Criteria

- The admission fee will be as per the latest government notification.
- Students have to fill up online application form available in College website www.sadiyacollege.org.in
- Candidates have to submit attested copies of all relevant documents of the (10+2) examination, caste certificate, gap certificate, as well as certificates of proficiency in co-curricular activities at the time of admission.
- Admission will be strictly on merit basis as per Govt. Reservation Rules.
- A student can opt for only those subjects in TDC in which he/she has passed in H.S. without grace marks.
- Original certificates have to be produced at the time of admission
- Students confirmed for admission will be entitled for offering honours in accordance with choice and eligibility. The students may have to face screening tests in order to admit in major courses of certain departments.
- Students failing to attend classes continuously in honours subject in the first 10 days of commencement of classes for the session 2021-22, his/her seat allotment/admission shall be cancelled. The vacant seat will then filled up through notification in the college notice board.
- Allotment of honours subject/seat for reservation quota as per Govt. rules in force.
- There is a provision for reservation of seats as per the following details.

Eligibility for Higher Secondary Programme in Arts, Science and Commerce:

A student who has passed the High School Leaving Certificate Examination, or an equivalent examination (10+) recognized as such by AHSEC, shall be eligible for admission into the First Year of the Two year H. S. programme in arts, Science and Commerce.



Eligibility for Bachelor Programme in Arts, Science and Commerce:

A student who has passed the Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) in Arts, Science and Commerce of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, or an equivalent examination (10+2) recognized as such by the University, shall be eligible for admission into the First Semester of the Six Semester Degree Course in Arts, Science and Commerce respectively in Semester system.



Facilities:

LIBRARY

The Central library of Sadiya College was established in 1982. It is a well-equipped library, centrally located with open access system providing right impetus for the intellectual growth of the students, teachers, research scholars and other around. The library is housed in an Assam type building with 3,000 sq. ft. floor area.



The library has a collection of 14,000 books with some special collection on Assamese Novels, compiled works of noted writers and women studies. It also has a good collection of encyclopedias, dictionaries, books on competitive examinations and a few collection of rare books.

The library is partially automated with Integrated Library management system named SOUL 3.0 which is crucial for automating in house activities and services of the library along with barcode facility. The Online Public Access catalogue (OPAC)





Facilities

is made available for library users to know the status of availability of books and documents in the library. The library uses Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC) system for classification of books.



The entire library complex is Wi-Fi enabled. Students can use internet facility inside the library. The library is an active member of INFLIBNET Centre and NLIST consortia.

The library offers various services to its users like automated circulation of books, online public access catalogue (OPAC), Reprography and library orientation.

UGC provides **Rs.5400/-** per month for a general degree course, **Rs.7800/-** per month for technical and professional courses.
5. **DST-INSPIRE Scholarship:** **INSPIRE Scholarship** for Higher Education (SHE) is a scholarship programme implemented by the Department of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India. It is a scholarship scheme that comes under Innovation in Science Pursuit for Inspired Research (INSPIRE), a flagship programme of DST. Meant for meritorious students undertaking bachelor's and master's courses in Natural and Basic Sciences, **INSPIRE Scholarship** offers 10,000 scholarships every year. Under SHE, each selected candidate receives INR 80,000 annually for pursuing any subject of Natural or Basic Sciences.

Student's Awards:

1. Students who secure a place within the first ten position in H.S. examination will be awarded special merit award with a merit certificate and cash award of **Rs.5000/-**.
2. As per G.B. resolution no. 04 held in 26/10/2018, student who secure highest percentage of marks among the candidates secure first position in degree (Science/Arts/Commerce), final examination from this college will be declared as the best graduate of Sadiya College for the year and awarded a special prize in the name of **Late. Bom Bahadur Chetry** and **Late. Bhairab Hazarika**.
3. The student who obtains highest percentage in the qualifying examinations among the students admitted into H.S. and Degree Course is allowed to study without paying tuition fee for his/her course of study.
4. **Mathematics Departmental Award:** The student who secured highest percentage of marks (minimum 60%) in mathematics will be awarded with this award. Also a special award will be given to the **University Gold medalist** in mathematics.
5. **Zoology Departmental Award:** The student who secured highest percentage of marks (minimum 60%) in zoology will be awarded with this award.

- No committee, society or association can be formed in the college without the permission of the Principal. No person is allowed to address a meeting in the college campus without the prior permission of the college authority.
- All notices desired to be circulated through social media/pasted by the students should take prior permission of college authority. Violation of this rule will lead to disciplinary action.
- Students are responsible for their conduct to the Principal and are prohibited from doing inappropriate things inside or outside of the College that interfere in the discipline and normal working of the college.
- Students should show good conduct both towards the members of college staff (teaching and administrative) and fellow students.
- **Any student who fails to attend at least 60% of the classes (including both online and offline) taught in an academic year will be declared DISCOLLEGIATE (DC) and will be debarred from appearing in the examination. Any student who fails to attend at least 80% of the classes taught will be declared NON-COLLEGIATE (NC) and allowed to sit for the examination only on payment of a fine.**
- Filled up registration form of council/university should be submitted in the college office within the stipulated time and students are advised to visit regularly the college website and notice board.
- **Students will be punished for-**
