

College Profile

adiya, a historically important sub-division of Tinsukia district, is located in the far east of the state of Assam. The unique culture of the region has been shaped by many ethnic groups living through different historical eras. Once geographically isolated, the surface communication gap of the region has been narrowed down recently with the completion of several strategically important infrastructural projects. The region is surrounded by Arunachal Pradesh in the East, river Brahmaputra and Dibang in the South and West, respectively. The region is rich in biodiversity with several species of important flora and fauna.

Most of the population of the locality rely on cultivation and only a few of them could send their children out of the sub-division for pursuing higher education. Geographical isolation was a major impediment in the pursuance of higher education outside the region. Under such circumstances some farsighted citizens decided to setup a degree college at Chapakhowa through a historic resolution adopted in the meeting held in the first half of August, 1982 at Sadiya Govt. H.S. School. As a result, Sadiya College was established in the middle of Chapakhowa town on 6th September, 1982 with a great vision. After few years of enthusiastic performance and dedicated services of the teaching and non-teaching staffs the college was brought under the Deficit-Grant-in-Aid system by the Govt. of Assam in 1989. In this regard, the inexhaustible patience and abled guidance of the founder Principal Mr. Kirti Chandra Phukan is really praiseworthy.

As the lone higher academic institution in this entire region the college has been providing a platform for the realization of academic dreams of thousands of students from Sadiya and nearby areas of Arunachal Pradesh since its inception. The college provides courses in Arts, Commerce and Science both in graduate and undergraduate levels. The mission of the college is to disseminate knowledge, cater inclusive education to all and train the students for self-reliance, sustainable development and as responsible global citizens.

Located in a campus of 42 bighas of land the college has decent infrastructural facilities. The classrooms and administrative offices are housed in a large assam type pucca building. The college has a separate library building with sufficient resources and reading space. In addition to these the college has facilities like science laboratories, computer and language laboratories, gymnasium, parking place, hostels and canteen. The college is equipped with internet facilities like high-speed WiFi and optical fiber.

Situated in the extreme eastern corner of Assam, Sadiya College is the lone seat of higher learning in the entire sub-division of Sadiya. It is a general degree college provincialized under Assam College Employee Provincialization Act No. XLVI of 2005. It is affiliated to Dibrugarh University and recognized by University Grants Commission. The college was accredited by NAAC with Grade B in 2024. Right from its inception the College has held the pride in disseminating undergraduate education to the learners of this culturally diverse and vibrant area in all the three streams, i.e., Arts (1982), Commerce (2009) and Science (2020). It also offers various Certificate and Diploma courses under Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University, Guwahati in areas relevant to the emerging global trends.

The College is trying to provide adequate modern infrastructure with digital classrooms, laboratories, library, multi-purpose playground and canteen facilities in spite of all the challenges. It is worth mentioning that this landmass had remained cut off, since time immemorial, from the rest of India by the rivers Lohit and Dibang, till two bridges were built over the rivers in 2015 and 2018 respectively. Since then, however, this area has witnessed some slow signs of development, and yes, like all other aspirations of the people of Sadiya, the developmental aspirations of the college too will take some time for getting fulfilled. In the meanwhile, the college authority is leaving no stone unturned to tap all possible resources with the sole purpose of developing Sadiya College into a modern, vibrant and reputed institute of higher learning.

2. Subjects offered in Four Year Under Graduate Programme: (Arts/ Science/ Commerce)

The under-graduate curriculum has been prepared in accordance to the National Education Policy 2020. The curriculum provides ample scope to the educators from Humanities, Science and Commerce to upgrade and customize the mechanisms involved in imparting of knowledge of various topics and courses as per the need of the hour. The Bachelor Degree under Dibrugarh University adapted as per there commendations of NEP 2020 with multiple entry/exit options within the period with appropriate certification/diploma/degree.

The college offers Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP) in Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) as prescribed by Dibrugarh University. This program leads to a One Year UG Certificate, Two Year UG Diploma, Three Year UG Degree, Four Year UG Degree (Honours) and Four Year UG Degree (Honours with Research).

- 1. Major: Major discipline is the discipline or subject of Main Focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits (about 50% of total credits) through or e courses of the major discipline.
- 2. Minor Offered in the Subjects: Minor discipline helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major discipline. (Shall be taken by the Students from the disciplines other than the major)
 - Arts Subjects: English, Assamese, Economics, History, Political Science, Sociology
 - Science Subjects: Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Botany, Zoology
 - Commerce Subjects: Banking and Insurance, Marketing, Finance
- 3. Multi-Disciplinary Generic Elective Courses (MDGEC): These courses are intended to broaden the intellectual experiences and form part of liberal arts and science education. However, students shall not be allowed to choose or repeat any of these courses already undergone at the Higher Secondary level (12th class) and the discipline which he/she has chosen as Major.

- 4. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): These courses aim to enabling the students to acquire and demonstrate the core linguistic skills, including critical reading and expository and academic writing skills. Students are required to achieve competency in the use of a MIL or Regional Language. All language disciplines except English shall offer Language Courses. The College offers
- MIL (Assamese) (1st Semester)
- Language and Communication Skills (English) (2nd Semester)
- 5. Value Added Courses (VAC): The courses aim to enable the students to acquire and demonstrate certain values.

1st Semester: VAC- 1A: Understanding India

OR

VAC- 1B: Health and Wellness

2nd Semester: VAC- 2A: Environment Education

OR

VAC- 2B: Yoga

3rd Semester: VAC- 3: Digital and Technological

Solutions/ Digital Fluency

6. Skill Enhancement courses (SEC): These courses are aimed at imparting practical skills, hands on training, soft skills etc. to enhance the employability of the students. The College will offer SEC papers in each department as prescribed by Dibrugarh University Syllabi. The students may opt any one paper offered the departments.

NB: The minimum and maximum credits to be opted by a student for qualifying of a Undergraduate programme shall be as per the Course Structure given as Annexure I.

Change in Major: Students shall be allowed to change major within the broad discipline at the end of the second semester by giving him/her sufficient time to explore interdisciplinary courses during the first year. The HEIs may create 10% additional seats over and above the sanctioned strength to accommodate there quest for a change of major.

Change in Minor: Students shall be allowed to change Minor courses of his/her areas of interest within the broad discipline at the end of the third semester. If a student pursuing a major obtains a minimum of 12 credits from another branch then the student will be awarded Bachelor degree in previous with a minor in later.

Definition of important terminology in FYUGP:

2. Credits: A 'credit' is a unit by which the coursework is measured. It determines the number of hours of instruction required per week over the duration of a semester (minimum 15weeks). A course may have only a lecture component or a lecture and tutorial component or a lecture and practicum component or a lecture, tutorial and practicum component, or only practicum component. Credit shall be defined as,

- 3. Academic Bank of Credits (ABC): 'Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)' is an academic service mechanism as a digital/virtual/online entity established and managed by MOE/ UGC to facilitate students to become its academic account holders and paving the way of seamless student mobility, between or within degree-granting Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) through a formal system of credit recognition, credit accumulation, credit transfers and credit redemption to promote distributed and flexible teaching learning.
- 4. Academic Flexibility: 'Academic Flexibility' is the provision for innovative and interchangeable curricular structures to enable creative combinations of Courses/ Programmes in disciplines of study leading to Certificate/ Diploma/ Degree of study offering multiple entry and multiple exit facilities removing the rigid curricular boundaries and creating new possibilities of life-long learning.
- 5. Credit accumulation: 'Credit Accumulation' means the facility created by ABC in the Academic Bank Account opened by the students across the country in order to transfer and consolidate the 'credits' earned by them by undergoing 'courses' in any of the eligible HEIs.
- 6. Credit recognition: 'Credit Recognition' means the credits earned through eligible/ partnering HEIs and transferred directly to the ABC by the concerned HEIs.



- 7. Credit redemption: 'Credit redemption' means the process of commuting the accrued 'credits' in the Academic Bank Account of the students maintained in ABC for the purpose of fulfilling the 'credits requirements' for the award of Certificates/ Diplomas/ Degrees etc. by the degree awarding HEIs.
- 8. Credit transfer: 'Credit transfers' means the mechanism by which the eligible HEIs registered with ABC are able to receive or provide prescribed 'credits' to individual registered ABC account in adherence to the UGC credit norms for the 'course/s' registered by the desirous students in any HEIs within India.

Progression and exits:

The progression and exits during the whole course structure is given below.

(a) After 1 Year One can exit just after one-year. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational / Skill course (Exit Course) of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Certificate. The minimum total credit requirements is 44 (and 4 credit extra for the exit Vocational / Skill course).



- (b) After 2 Years One can exit the programme after two-year course as well. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational / Skill course of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Diploma. The minimum total credit requirements are 84 (and 4 credits extra for the exit Vocational / Skill course).
- (c) After 3 Years If a student completes 3 years, he/she can exit the programme. In this case the student will get a Bachelor's Degree. The minimum total credit requirements are 120.
- (d) After 4 Years After completion of 4 years, the student gets either a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) with Research. The minimum total credit requirements is 160.

It should be noted that any certificate / diploma / degree is awarded only if the student clears (i.e. passes) all the required courses (papers) till that point of time. However, a student can complete his FYUGP within a maximum period of 7 years.

INFRASTRUCTURE, LEARNING RESOURCES AND ALLIED FACILITIES

LIBRARY:

The central library of Sadiya College has a collection of 16000 books with some special collection on North East region and Women studies. It has good collection of encyclopaedias, dictionaries, books on competitive examinations and a few collection of rare books, Assamese Novels, compiled works of noted writers, Assamese science literature. The library is partially automated with Integrated Library Management System (SOUL 3.0). The Dewey decimal classification system is used for classification of books. The entire library complex is Wi-Fi enabled. The library offers services like automated circulation of books, online public access catalogue; reprography etc. The library of the College has the following collection on 31st March 2025.

GENERAL RULES FOR LIBRARY

- Books once picked out from the stack should be left in the reading table if not issued out.
- The physical condition of the book should be checked while checking out. Mutilation of pages if found is to be brought to the notice of the circulation. Otherwise, the borrower himself/ herself shall be responsible for mutilation of the book, if detected afterwards.
- Underlining, marking or folding of pages of issued books is strictly prohibited.
- Member caught removing of pages/ stealing books or otherwise mutilation books will be suspended forthwith from using library facilities and disciplinary action will be initiated against him/ her by the college authority.
- The librarian reserves the right to suspend or delinquent membership of any member found misbehaving, abusing the library staff or behaving in an indecent manner in the Reading Room.
- Upon any violation of the library rules, members shall forfeit privileges of admission and membership of the library.







HOSTEL:

Sadiya College has two hostels, oneeach for Girls and Boys within the premises with 26 seat capacity each. Application forms are available at the college office during the time of admission. The Hostel Management Committee will finalize the list of candidates on merit basis. Those admitted to the hostels will have to abide by the college hostel rules.

GYMNASIUM:

The College has a fitness centreto promote healthy lifestyle and sportsmanship among students and faculty members. The Centre is equipped with a variety of modern fitness equipments. It has allotted a Gym In-Charge for the students and faculty members as well as to look after the gym.

SPORTS FACILITIES:

COMPUTER LABORTARY:

Complementing the computer education facilities, the college has also established a dedicated computer laboratory which can accommodate more than 30 students at a time. The laboratory provides the must-needed computing facility to skill the students with coding languages.

SCIENCE LABORATORY:

Although the science stream of the college is at a very nascent stage, the college maintains descent laboratory facilities to fulfil the requirements of the students. Currently, the college has three wet labs and one dark room for optics related experimentation.

WI-FI & INTERNET:

In order to equip with the digitalized and informative world, the college campus is enhanced with access to internet facilities for students and staff that provide free high speed Wi-Fi through optical fibre.













PARKING:

The College has sufficient parking space for both the students and employees separately. The parking lots are easily accessible from two different entrances from the main road.

The college has sufficient number of classrooms integrated with ICT based teaching learning systems. The college also has a well maintained dedicated digital conference hall.

The UGC has launched a special scholarship scheme "ISHAN UDAY" for meritorious students from North-East. Under the ISHAN UDAY Scheme, the UGC awards INR 10000/- new scholarships every year for students starting degree courses, professional and technical courses, including medical and paramedical courses. UGC provides INR 5400/- per month for a general degree course and INR 7800/- per month for technical as well as professional courses.

5. DST-INSPIRE Scholarship:

INSPIRE Scholarship for Higher Education (SHE) is a scholarship programme implemented by the Department of science and Technology (DST), Government of India. It is a scholarship scheme that comes under Innovation in Science Pursuit for Inspired Research (INSPIRE), a flagship programme of DST. Meant for meritorious students undertaking Bachelor's and Master's courses in Natural and Basic Sciences, the INSPIRE Scholarship offers INR 10000/- scholarship every year. Under SHE, each selected candidate receives INR 80000/- annually for pursuing any subject of Natural or Basic Sciences.

6. Students' Awards:

✓ "Late Maniki Saikia Best Graduate Award of Sadiya College" - The award is instituted by Dr. Bornali Saikia, Asstt. Professor, Dept. of Mathematics, Sadiya College, in memory of her grandmother Late Maniki Saikia. The award carries a cash prize of Rs. 10,000.00 and is awarded to the highest scorer in final result of the degree course across all three streams.

- The courses offered by the Sadiya College are full time courses. No students can take any other full time courses concurrently. If any student is admitted to any other course, then the student/guardian should inform the college authority immediately.
- No committee, society or association can be formed in the college without the
 permission of the Principal. No person is allowed to address a meeting in the
 college campus without the prior permission of the college authority.
- All notices desired to be circulated through social media/pasted by the students should take prior permission of college authority. Violation of this rule will lead to disciplinary action.
- Students are responsible for their conduct to the Principal and are prohibited from doing inappropriate things inside or outside of the College that interfere in the discipline and normal working of the college.
- Students should show good conduct both towards the member of the college staff (teaching and administrative) and fellow students.
- Filled up registration form of council/university should be submitted in the college office within the stipulated time and students are advise to visit regularly the college website and notice board.

Students will be punished for:

- Participation and encouraging in ragging of any type. Govt. rules on ragging

Attendance:

A student who has less than 80% attendance in average shall not be permitted to sit for the End-semester examination. However, that it shall be open to the college to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reasons, on recommendation of the Principals of the College on payment of a prescribed fee(s).

Examination and Evaluation:

- a. Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least two times during a semester including the End Semester Examination.
- b.Thereshallbe20%marksforin-semesterassessmentand80%marks-forEnd-semesterexaminationineachcourseduringeverysemester.

c.In-semester Assessment:

- i) In semester assessment, different tools such as objective tests, written tests, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work, etc. suitable to the courses may be employed.
- ii) The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shallberequiredtocompulsorilyattendin-semesterassessmentin-cludingappearingthesessional tests, failing which they will not be allowed to appear for the End-semesterexamination. AstudentcannotrepeatIn-semester-examinations.
